

Project: Culture and Free Thought association

The Cultural and Free Thought Association (CFTA), aims through this project to raise the voices of women to implement 1325 agenda and for women inclusion in peace and security processes as well as political participation, in addition to raise the voices of youth on issues affecting their lives in Gaza. CFTA will select 60 youth (30 male and 30 female) and raise their knowledge in Woman Peace and Security Agenda, National Action Plan to implement 1325 in Palestine in addition to Gender concepts, this knowledge will be accompanied with capacity building of their skills on radio production, social media and standup comedy, the 60 youth will be selected based on different criteria, and will be divided into three groups based on the above-mentioned skills so 20 youth will be trained on each skill. Afterwards those youth will target 300 men and women from Gaza who are members of the CFTA, to transfer the knowledge and skills they acquired, as well as to have their input on the topic of the campaign that will be conducted at the end of the project.

Actor: Culture and Free Thought Association

The Culture and Free Thought Association is a community-based organization that was established in 1991 by opening Al Shruq Wal Amal Center for children between the ages of 6 to 12. CFTA came as a response to the socio-political situation in 1991 and especially its effect on women and children. The programs initiated at the time aimed at providing secure places for children where they could get social and psychological support as well as enjoy recreational activities. CFTAs program was the first of its kind in the Gaza Strip and still is unique especially with the quality of services provided to the target groups.

CFTA was initiated by 5 women who at the time represented 5 different political parties who are all members of the PLO. In 1991, CFTA was an initiative, even the name was not yet assigned for the association, and it was like a movement that is advocating for better change in the life of children and women.

The work of CFTA grew and expanded every year. By 1995, CFTA was running 4 centres: Shruq Wal Amal Center, Bunat Il Ghad for teenagers, the Women Health Center and the Gaza Womens Loan Fund. The team expanded from 13 staff to 25 employees.

It was in 1996 when CFTA moved from being a community initiative to being an organisation. It was registered with the Ministry of Interior in Gaza and new management, account and administrative system started to build up to become today one of the most professional organizations in Gaza Strip.

Today, in 2010, CFTA runs 8 different programs:

- 2 children centres
- One teenagers/ adolescents centre
- Two women centres
- Youth/ cultural program
- Mentoring program
- And a network for CBOs from the south
